Welcome to the first edition of our community newsletter

The 1.5-acre former ABC Cinema site that sits on the corner of Mount Pleasant Road and Church Road has been derelict for more than two decades. Retirement Villages were delighted to secure planning permission at the turn of the year to develop a Thrive Living collection integrated retirement community here, in the heart of Royal Tunbridge Wells.

The investment re-imagines this long disused space in such a prominent location and will enliven this part of the town centre. The Thrive Living collection aims to put older people back at the heart of our communities, whilst providing choice, flexibility, and wellbeing to those choosing to make the community their home.

With construction work set to begin in early 2024, we wanted to connect with the wider Tunbridge Wells community, and we propose to share updates, via this regular newsletter. What is coming to **Tunbridge Wells?**

Planning consent was granted in Winter 2022/2023 for a later living community in this key town centre location. Featuring more than 160 new homes, all with access to outdoor space and on-site amenities, the development will also improve a key thoroughfare for the community at large to move from Mouth Ephraim through to Clanricarde Road, via a new central landscaped courtyard, that will provide a space for residents and the wider community to come together.

We have been busy behind the scenes preparing over recent weeks and are targeting a 'start-onsite' in early 2024. As plans advance, we will be glad to update all those with an interest in this site and its progress.
